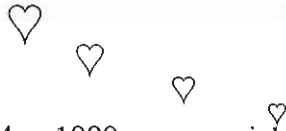

HEART HOLIDAY



On Sunday, Feb. 14, 1999 a special Valentine's party was held for the children and moms from Park Road and Spring Road shelters in northwest D.C. Food, love and hygiene articles were plentiful and many good things, including the Word of God were sown into these families' lives. The children enjoyed participating in the "Heart Chart" skit with large, colorful cardboard heart faces as they examined the sinner heart vs. the pure heart, washed in the blood of Jesus. Laurel Tabernacle's Dance team, led by Amina Priester and husband was present to minister and bless in a powerful way and a young preacher, Steve Meyers from Laurel Tabernacle delivered a strong Gospel testimony and altar call. Many children and some parents came forward and gave their hearts to the Lord. This ultimate Valentine of Love from Jesus was received and the ultimate blessing to the Lord of hearts turned over to Him was given.

TRANSPORTATION PROVIDER

On two occasions recently, the Homeless Outreach was requested by the Community of Hope Shelters, I and II to provide transportation for outings already planned by others for the families in the shelters. Since transportation is not our strong point, we are praising God that He had the means available for us to assist in this way. *On Saturday, April 23rd*, 45 children and mothers boarded the bus, (graciously provided by Believer's Victory Christian Center in Waldorf, MD) and headed for an afternoon at the Baltimore Aquarium. A donor had provided tickets for Aquarium admission, as well as to the dolphin show. The children had an enjoyable time. A few days before the trip, another donor had given 36 adorable "new" stuffed animals to the National Church of God to give to the homeless children. God's timing is perfect. The number of stuffed animals fit perfectly with the number of children on board. Jehovah Jireh showed Himself to be our true Provider in other ways, as well. When we arrived at the Baltimore Harbor parking lot, prepared to pay \$20, we found the attendant had left for the day, so parking was free. As we attempted to leave the Aquarium that evening, the Lord came through miraculously by providing a mechanic, when it appeared that the bus would not start and we would be stuck in front of the Aquarium with the children and mothers indefinitely. After a group prayer, the only father who had come on the trip was able to use his skills to start the bus with the use of several metal pipes, when all other attempts had failed. To God be the glory. Gospel Tracts were given to the parents as they left the bus. *This Saturday, May 15*, the Homeless Outreach will again transport these families, this time to the Oxon Hill farm for a day of cow milking and hay riding. ***God is Good!***

On Saturday, April 3, the Homeless Outreach was able to team up with the Evangel Assembly of God Church in Clinton, Maryland and offer a wonderful time of ministry and celebration to participants from three area shelters. Forty women and children from Shepherd's Cover Shelter, Community of Hope II and Monloch Shelter (Alexandria, VA) were present to reap not only the benefits of the pizza party, the Hillbilly Harriette clowning and the beautiful Easter Drama production put on by Evangel, but the spiritual blessings that the Lord poured out, as well. God used the delicious (and plentiful) pizza from Papa John's, the fun and games of Hillbilly Harriette and the stirring Musical on the death and resurrection and soon coming of Christ to touch the hearts of the children and mothers. Eight of the 12 mothers went up to receive Christ after the service and, according to Hillbilly Harriette, such a powerful move of God took place among the children, that there were children weeping before the Lord and three (including two from the shelters) got the baptism in the Holy Ghost! We truly praise God for this mighty breakthrough of the Holy Spirit in their lives. Such a beautiful presence of God was experienced even after the services were over, that it was difficult to bring the evening to a conclusion. As the mothers and children lingered, they were full of joyful praise to the Lord and of thanks to all who had made the event possible. Each family received a large bag of hygiene items, a Bible and Sunday school materials for the children as they left. They were very thankful for these gifts also.
