## LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR, Carol Leo

I studied the ocean waves and asked myself, "What are they really doing?" A wall of water quickly builds to a crescendo and comes crashing down. In five seconds, what had appeared to be a spectacular buildup for a big event has flattened into nothingness. Our Lord said in James 1:6-7 "But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord."

As I thought about the qualities that characterize this kind of faith that God requires, I thought about perseverance and then I couldn't help but think about our team that has been faithfully serving at Shepherd's Cove for the last three years. There is no ebb and flow in their service. Every second Friday of the month they arrive at the shelter, not because of man's acclaim or because it is a convenient thing to do, but because of the love of Christ Himself that is within, sustaining and leading them to minister. The work is being done, not unto man, but unto the Lord who saved each one and lovingly raised them up to go forward and manifest His love to others.

Sometimes, those who make the most spectacular claims about their plans to help in ministry end up with no substance at all. Like a wave of the sea, they put on a big show with words, but there is no sustaining power behind their claims, and the beautiful and promising wave is nowhere to be found very soon after the display. James 2:17-20 states "Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works. Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble. But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?"

My prayer is for the continual leading of the Lord as we reach out in love to serve those who find themselves broken by life's circumstances and at a place where only faith can make the difference. May we be steadfast and immovable in the Lord as we minister.

## Requests from the Shelters

Included below are lists of needed items from two of the shelters to which we minister. Many times people call with items they would like to donate to one of the shelters. The lists below can be found on the shelter websites and should be helpful. Thank you and God Bless you!

### **Community of Hope and Hope Apartments, Items Needed:**

- Plastic Storage Bins (medium and large) with lids
- Garment Racks or Armoires with poles for hanging clothing
- Lamps (table or standing/pole lamps)
- Dressers
- Sofas and Loveseats (in great condition; no holes, rips, tears, broken parts or stains)
- Dinette sets that seat four or more
- Bed frames (metal frames preferred)
- Dishes (plastic cups, plates, silverware, pots and pans); sets preferred
- Bakeware
- Vacuum Cleaner (only those in good working condition with no missing parts)
- Laundry Baskets/Hampers
- Sheets (twin, full and queen-sized) and pillow-cases; matching sets preferred but will take singles pieces
- Blankets/Comforters (twin, full and queen-sized)
- Shower Curtains
- Towels and Washcloths
- TV Converter Boxes
